- Frequent bowler (5 weeks or more of regular activity) statistics were recorded in 30
 Qld centres of 9,533
- Registered Qld TBA membership rose to 8752 of which 996 were juniors
- Registered persons with a disability actively engaged in frequent bowling rose to
 872 (report from 19 Qld centres)
- Over **70,000** families enjoyed regular bowling without being league members (report from 21 centres)
- **7830** non English speaking background attended 12 of our Qld bowling centres
- 580 High School visits during school hours were recorded with 17,064 students participating (report from 16 centres)
- 216 Primary Schools visited Centres in school hours recorded 5905 students participating (report from 8 centres)





- 1331 persons accessed
 Learn to Bowl assistance (report from 18 Qld Centres)
- 2016 year 31,860 persons with a disability who are members of lead agencies supporting persons with a disability (Endeavor, Special Olympics, local organized community and carers groups attend centres – report from 20 Qld Centres) bowled for enjoyment.
- 42,252 participants from 'other groups' vacation care, senior groups, social and corporate clubs, church fellowship bowled in 2016 (report from 15 centres)
- 592,287 social players enjoyed tenpin (report from 19 Qld centres) formula used: total social play games, divided by 4 yearly visits divided by 2 games.

TBAQ 2016 database of Coaches and Managers:

- Qld has 12 Level 1 coaches, 40 Bronze coaches, 15 Silver Coaches -Total coach workforce of 80 Accredited Coaches in 2016
- TBAQ held 3 Coach workshops in 2016
- Managers: Qld has 20 State Team Managers Qld has 4 MPIO's
- Teacher Professional Development Program Southern Cross University 404 trained.
- Equipment specialists: Qld has 18
- Local Centre Championships 8 of 30 centres reported they hold local Championships
- Junior Co-ordinators 12 of 21 centres reported they have a junior coordinator
- Coordinator for persons with a disability 11 of the 21 centres reported they have a dedicated person to assist PWD
- 12 Centre Associations of 30 have the Manager as a key person as the key Association contact in Qld



Sport Development -


- 57,988 children participated in Roll 'n Strike in school program using modified carpet lanes, full size pins and balls in Queensland
- 67 juniors and youths attended the Kelly Kulick (American Pro Bowler brought over to Australia by TBAQ to upskill our coaches and players) State Development program.
- 79 Juniors attended Junior Development camps in Qld
- Qld Talent ID program 12 juniors and youths (14yrs to 21 yrs) and 2 Officials incentive program travelled overseas to Malaysia to contest the Milo
 International Junior All Stars Tournament. Our Qld youth bowler Blayne
 Fletcher won the event with 700 contestants registered. Sunway Mega Lanes 48
 lane Centre. 5 of our 12 juniors made the final stage of the tournament and 2 of our youngest recorded personal best games and series.




Sport Pathways:

- 115 juniors participated in Junior zone championships
- 40 juniors attended **junior roll offs** for state teams
- 53 participants attended the **Qld Junior Cup** 2016 figures 50% higher than the inaugural year 2015 (2017 has 84 registered and climbing to attend July 2017)
- 43 Youths attended the **Sharp Youth Competition**
- 30 Teams of 3 bowlers participated in **Qld Interschool Challenge**
- Qld Disabilities Championships attracted 102 participants
- Adult State Championships were held in Bundaberg with 42 participants
- Adult & Youth State Team roll offs Adult open 27, Restricted category 17, Seniors category 10, Youth 17 participants
- **State Based Training Squad** is also offered to all category of bowlers each year.
